#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

Bhartiya Shikshan Prasarak Sanstha's, (BSPS) Shri Siddheshwar Mahavidyalaya, Majalgaon is at Majalgaon in Beed District of Marathwada region of Maharashtra State and is affiliated to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad. Among other features of backwardness, educational backwardness was the prominent feature of the region. Realizing the need of the region some of the teachers and prominent citizens from the society came together and formed BSP Sanstha at Ambajogai in June 1951. The name of the Institution points out that emphasis is on "Bhartiyatwa". Its philosophy is based on the concept of what is essentially Indian in all walks of life. The work was started with the motto "Kelyane Hot Ahere! Aadhi Kelechi Pahije". The message given by a Maharashtrian Saint Samrath Ramdas in his "Dasbodh" Granth in their words "Work is Worship" (It means doing work is a must to get the work done.) The vision of the Institution is "To build a tradition of ideal citizens loyal to democracy, virtuous, scholarly, morally sound, and nationalist through Indian Education." With this vision BSPS runs schools and colleges (Sanskar Kendras) at different places in the Marathwada region. It took a decision to step in to the field of higher education and started Shri Siddheshwar Mahavidyalaya in June 1996 at Majalgaon, Dist. Beed, (M.S.). Shri Siddheshwar Mahavidyalaya works with these Objectives:- 1. To make available various courses at UG and PG level for the students. 2. To equip the students for global competency by providing them knowledge & necessary skills. 3. To cultivate moral values among the students which include Human Rights, Social Justice, Secularism, democracy etc. 4. To develop all round personality of the students by providing proper facilities and healthy atmosphere. 5. To create awareness about modern technology among the students. 6. To make available various skill oriented courses to the students so that they will get job or become self-employed. 7. To contribute in social awakening and social change through education.

To follow the objectives, Shri Siddheshwar Mahavidyalaya has been working since 1996. This is a co-education Junior & Senior College permanently affiliated to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad having recognition of UGC under sections 2(f) and 12(B). The college is located in the heart of the town and has the campus of almost 1.3 acres which include class rooms, administrative wing, Laboratories, games room, Gymnasium, Ladies room, Library, reading room grounds etc. The college has Arts and Commerce faculties which provide B.A. and B.Com. Courses on grant in aid basis. In Arts faculty there are thirteen subjects. Each subject being a separate department which are English, Hindi, Marathi, Sociology, History, Political Sciences, Public Administration, Economics, etc. In Commerce faculty almost twenty subjects are being taught but it is treated as one department. In addition the college offer the subjects Sanskrit, Music, Drama and T. M. P. A. on Non-Grant basis. The college runs B.Sc. course under Science Faculty. In Science Faculty there are six departments which are Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology, Botany and Computer Science. It also runs PG courses in Marathi (M.A. Marathi), on non-grant basis. The college is working in rural area at Taluka place where the large number of students are from economically backward sections. This puts limitations on sources of finance. In addition it is away from train tracks which resulted in to absence of big industries and markets. The grants provided by state govt, and UGC are the only major sources of finance for the college. In spite of these limitations the college is putting all possible efforts in the all-round development of students. The first NAAC accreditation of the college has done in Oct. 2009. Since then the college is working towards quality enhancement as a part of which a decision of reaccreditation was taken. IQAC is established and it is active since 2009. To complete the process of reaccreditation, several committees are working under the guidance of IQAC. As the college is working with Arts, Science and Commerce faculties, the departments under reaccreditation are English, Marathi, Hindi, Sanskrit, Sociology, History, Pol. Science, Pub. Adm., Music, Economics, Drama, TMPA, Commerce, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology, Botany and Computer Science. The AQARs are promptly submitted to NAAC for the period from 2009-10 to 2014-15. In preparation of SSR for reaccreditation, the entire teaching and non-teaching staff was involved and have put their sincere efforts. We have tried to prepare SSR by following NAAC Guidelines as closely as possible.

#### SUMMARY OF THE SELF STUDY REPORT

#### **Criterion wise Analysis**

#### Criteria – I – Curricular Aspects

Curriculum is given by affiliating University. A detailed Annual Teaching plan is made in the beginning of the year. Teaching process is implemented and monitored as per the plan. Principal, Vice Principal and HOD's monitor the teaching process. For effective monitoring Teachers Academic Diary is maintained by every teacher in which Annual Teaching Plan, "Daily Lesson Notes" and Monthly Teaching Reports are regularly recorded. Courses and curriculum are according to the goals and objectives of the college. They are suitable for overall development of the students, and also help in developing the global competencies among students. It also contains the aspects of value based education. Several courses and subject options (as per the rules of affiliating University) are available to students so that they can choose appropriate course and subject. Feedback on curriculum is obtained from students and teachers. Teachers give feedback on curriculum to the members of B.O.S., University officers, academic experts and stake holders. Teachers participate in curriculum design and development as and when they get opportunity. One faculty member contributes in design and development of curriculum as B.O.S.

#### Criteria II – Teaching Learning Evaluation

The admission process is transparent. Admissions are given as per the rules of University and Govt. Special admission committee is established to monitor the entire process. Wide publicity of admission process is always made to give access to students from different geographical area and different socio-economic, cultural and educational backgrounds. Admissions are open to all, irrespective of cast, creed, religion, gender etc. Suitable programs are offered as to satisfy the needs of the students from different backgrounds. Gender equity and opportunity for differently abled students are also ensured. Teaching process is carefully planned and monitored by college. Teaching methods applied by teachers are suitable to make the learning easy. Advanced learners and slow learners are considered in teaching process. Teachers apply interactive and participatory approach and consider the abilities of students. Teachers use appropriate teaching aids including ICT for effective learning. Extra periods are taken wherever necessary. Library resources are effectively used in teaching learning process. Question-answers, group discussions and other techniques are used in teaching process. Teachers are qualified and experienced. The recruitment of teachers is made as per the rules and regulations of the UGC and Govt. Adequate teachers are appointed for all subjects. Teachers are very keen about their professional development, research and extension activities. Teachers participate in orientation courses, Refresher courses, conferences and seminars. Some teachers are busy in doctoral research. Some teachers have recognitions as research guide for Ph.D. Evaluation process is implemented as per the rules of University. Reforms in evaluation process are always introduced by University. Presently semester system of examination is in force. University conducts the examination process. College conducts college level evaluation as per the guidelines of the University. Student's grievances regarding evaluation are promptly addressed as per University rules. Student's performance is encouraging which reflects the learning outcome. The results of UG and PG courses are increasing and progressive. This is also reflected through increasing admissions of students. Results of UG and PG courses are always in the range of 80% to 90% since last five years. Some students got success in competitive examinations and some got opportunities in Industry.

#### Criteria – III Research, consultancy and extension.

Research committee is established in the college for the promotion of research. Library facility, internet facility, Reading room facility and other facilities are provided to faculty to facilitate research. Adequate opportunities are given to faculty to participate in conferences and seminars and to present papers. 40% of the faculty have completed Ph.D. 60% of faculty is doing Ph.D. Two faculty members are doing post-doctoral research under Minor Research Project scheme funded by UGC. Four faculty members are working as recognized research guide of the University for Ph.D. Almost all faculty members have presented and published research papers in national and international conferences. During next three years almost 90% of the faculty will be Ph.D. and will be engaged in postdoctoral research. At present the consultancy activities are not significant as the major faculty is busy in doing Ph.D. Within next five years the areas of consultancy will be identified and consultancy work will be implemented effectively. The college encourages students and teachers for extension activities. Various measures are taken to promote these activities. NSS and student council are the major mechanisms used for extension activities. The extension activities are organized for the benefit of the community in general and community in rural area as special. Emphasis is given on Health, Educations, RTI, Environment and National Integrity through extension activity. Participation of students, teachers and community is encouraged. About 300 students in NSS and 100 students in student associations are involved in extension activities. Through extension activities the college teachers and student work for Institutional social Responsibility. The college has no formal agreement with other agencies. Faculty works with teachers in other colleges of our sanstha.

#### **Criteria IV – Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

The college is located in the heart of the city in 1.75 acre area. Adequate infrastructure is available for the efficient conduct of the educational activities. The college has twenty eight class rooms, two computer labs, and separate reading rooms for students and teachers. The college has playground for outdoor games like, Volleyball, Ball Badminton, Ring Teniquite, Cricket, and room for indoor games like Table Tennis, Carom, and Chess etc. All facilities are for boys and girls. The college has separate sanitary blocks of boys, girls, and teachers. There is separate drinking water facility for boys, girls and teachers. Recently the college established a water purification plant. The college has one close multipurpose auditorium cum A / Vroom. Well-furnished Principals and Vice Principals cabins, well equipped office and specious Library building is available to college. Separate spaces are provided to Dept. of computer science, Dept. of Commerce, Department of Physical education, Examination department, Competitive exam cell, Network resource center, salary earners co-operative society and cafeteria. Vehicle parking

facility is available to students and staff. Class Rooms and other infrastructure are well furnished and maintained. Adequate facilities are available for women and differently abled students. The college has a library with 15,849 books and about 30 journals. It has internet facility & Xerox facility. Library works under the guidance of Library committee. The college has adequate IT infrastructure. The computer student ratio is 1:34, Computerization of office, Library and examination dept. is made. Use of ICT in teaching is increasing. Two IT labs are available in college. CCTV system is established in the college campus. The process of Wi-Fi campus is in progress. Presently two access points of Wi-Fi modem are working. The maintenance of IT infrastructure is promptly made by the concern department. Computer access is given to students and faculty. The infrastructure facilities are augmented from time to time. The optimum use of infrastructure is ensured by LMC and Principal. The college activities start at 8.00 am and continue till 5 pm. The college campus remains busy for 09 hours a day. For augmentation and maintenance of infrastructure, Infrastructure committee works under the chairmanship of principal. The committee deals with all issues related to infrastructure. It identifies the need of funds, prepares budget and do the needful. Girl's students are encouraged to participate in college activities. Students counseling is made for higher studies, employment, and selfemployment. About 50 students each from NSS, sports and cultural sections participate in inter college activities every year and get some prizes also.

#### Criteria – V – Students support and Progression

Efforts are made for students support and progression. Competitive exam guidance center, Grievance Redressal Cell and student's feedback are the mechanisms for the students support. Competitive exam cell works for career guidance, placement, personality development etc. Student's feedback is obtained regularly to know the difficulties of students. Attempts are made for the student's progression to higher studies. The average rate of progression from UG to PG is 30% to 40% Participation of students in social, cultural sports and other activities is ensured through NSS, Students Council, Sports Association, Cultural Association and other mechanisms.

#### Criteria – VI – Governance, Leadership and Management

The college works under the guidance of LMC and Executive Council of sanstha. The vision, mission and goals of the sanstha and college are clear and stated. They are communicated to all. There is a sound co-ordination and understanding between sanstha and college. The college activities are performed through principal, vice principal, H.O.D."s and teachers. Decisions are always participatory. More than 23 committees are in function to perform academic, administrative, curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities. Every teacher is involved in activities. College activities are planned, monitored and implemented carefully. Meetings at opening and at the end of the each term are regularly arranged in which review of all activities is taken. Efforts are made for the professional development of teaching and non-teaching staff. Performance appraisal of staff is regularly made. The issues like budget, finance, resources and utilization of funds are regularly discussed and sorted out in LMC meetings. Internal Quality Assurance Cell is active and working regularly. It put efforts for quality enhancement of college activities. AQARs and other reports are prepared by IQAC and sent to NAAC promptly. As the head of the

institution, principal coordinates all the activities. He is assisted by two vice principals and office superintendent. Monthly review meetings are taken. Term wise reports of all activities are collected. All issues are discussed in the meetings of LMC and guidance of sanstha office bearers is sought. Alumni Association of college is established and undertakes regular meetings. Alumni, visit college occasionally and participate in college acti

#### **Criteria – VII- Innovations and best practices**

College is always careful for all round development of students, value educations, character building and nationalism. All activities of college are arranged with these objectives. Students and teachers are free from addiction. Campus is tobacco free. The teacher student's relations are healthy. Environmental awareness is maintained. Rainwater harvesting scheme is implemented. Tree plantation and gardening is made wherever possible. The college has implemented two best practices i.e. Extracurricular activities and adopted village scheme.

The vision and mission is stated in the constitution of Sanstha. It is discussed frequently in all meetings held by Sanstha. Mission of the Sanstha is,

- To provide graduate and post graduate under various faculties in and around Majalgaon area.
- To provide Adult and Continuing Education Services.
- To cultivate moral values among the students which include human rights, social justice, secularism, democracy and eradication of untouchability.
- To develop all round personality of the students by providing proper facilities and suitable healthy atmosphere.
- To create awareness of the modern technology among students.
- To make available various skill-oriented courses to students. So that they will get the job or become self employed.
- To contribute in social awakening and social change through education.

These objectives are always discussed in staff meetings, student's meeting and meetings of Sanstha. The objectives are included in 'Teacher's Academic Diary' and 'Nonteaching Employee's Work Diary'. It is communicated to teachers and other stake holders at various occasions.

# 1.1.2 How does the institution develop and deploy action plans for effective implementation of the curriculum? Give details of the process and substantiate through specific example(s).

A detailed meeting of all teachers is held in the beginning of the year. The Principal and vice principal give all instructions regarding curriculum in this meeting. An Academic calendar is prepared. Departmental meetings are held in which subjects/papers are allotted to the teachers. Every teacher is required to submit teaching plan of every paper allotted to him. This plan contains all details regarding implementation of curriculum. Teaching plans are collected and verified by the principal. Monthly teaching reports are collected and implementation of teaching plan is reviewed. The entire process is monitored through teacher's academic diary. This diary is a comprehensive record of academic activities. Every teacher is required to maintain the academic diary and expected to obtain signature by the vice-principal and the principal every month.

At the end of each term the review is taken about the completion of the academic assignments of the teachers through the reports submitted by them. If it is found that there

are short comings in implementations the concerned teacher is made aware about the short comings and informed to make corrections.

## 1.1.3 What type of support (procedural and practical) do the teachers receive (from the University and/or institution) for effectively translating the curriculum and improving teaching practices?

Every teacher receives a copy of curriculum, and receives guidance from Principal, Vice-Principal and HOD regarding teaching plan and its implementation. Library provides reference books, text books and other instructional material relevant to curriculum. Every teacher receives pattern of question paper and scheme of marking of university examination. Latest reference books and text books are purchased and provided to teachers. To understand the latest publications in the subject, publisher's catalogues are provided.

Mahavidyalaya provides information regarding curriculum in prospectus. Details of curriculum are given to students by concern teachers at the beginning of the academic year in the classroom. The list of the reference and text books is given to students by subject teachers at the beginning of the academic year.

For B.A. students i) Music, ii) Dramatics, iii) Sanskrit, iv) Mahatma Phule Ambedkar Vichardhara. For B.Sc. it is Computer Science. For B.A. students 100 Hours Computer Course. For B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. students Environment Awareness Course. We offer these courses only after permission of State Government and approval of University. The admission is given on first come first serve basis. The Curriculum and fees structure for this program is provided by the University. We appoint faculty, provide teaching and library facility.

Yes, Mahavidyalaya provides skill oriented programmes relevant to regional and global employment markets to keep pace with the changing global trends and needs with the help of following curriculum.

For B.A. students '100 Hours Computer Course' is compulsory. Our B.Sc. programme includes the subject of Computer Science as optional subject. B.Com. programme include the subjects IT and its Application in Business.

From wide range of courses Mahavidyalaya chooses appropriate curriculum and courses provided by university which are in the line of our goals and objectives. It takes care while choosing programmes as to ensure the integrity between programme and objectives.

We have three year degree courses in Arts, Science and Commerce faculties according to our basic objective of providing higher education in rural area. Science, Commerce and Computer courses have a relevance to the regional, national and global trends. Arts courses are in the line of our objectives for all round development of students and value based education.

The Mahavidyalaya has not any scope in modification of programmes that are given by university. Yet considering the feedback of students and teachers on program, suggestions are forwarded to B O S informally as and when required. Teachers are facilitated to attend the workshops on curriculum organized by the university and take efforts to enrich the curriculum at the time of modification of the syllabus of the concerned subject.

All programs are offered to all students irrespective of gender discriminations. Regarding climatic changes and environmental education, university has made it compulsory to all students. Every student is required to complete the course on environment. Human rights education is given to students through formal subjects like pol.sci. & public Administration as well as through extracurricular activities under NSS and other students associations. ICT is the facility provided through curriculum to B.A., B. Sc, B.Com and M.A.(Marathi) students. Every student who does not have access to ICT through curriculum is required to complete the '100 hours computer course' designed by university.

Moral and ethical values are inculcated through the humanities and social sciences with these subjects are offered to students at B.A. level. Employability and life skill are developed through B.Sc., B.Com. courses and through Music and Drama in Arts faculty. Better career options are provided to students through the courses like B.A., B.Sc., B.Com and M.A.(Marathi).

For development of community orientation extension activities are organized through NSS and students are involved in it. Special camping programmes are undertaken by NSS every year in which the core idea is community orientation. We prepare comprehensive plan of extra- curricular activities of student's forums keeping in view to cultivate moral and ethical values and skills among the students. The plans are prepared for cultural activities, debate and elocution activities, Students council activities, NSS & Sports. Mahavidyalaya provides career development guidance and competitive exam guidance through Career Guidance personally.

1.3.5 Citing a few examples enumerate on the extent of use of the feedback from stakeholders in enriching the curriculum?

Mahavidyalaya has feedback mechanism for students, parents, employees and community through various methods time to time. The students have given full freedom to give their feedback on curriculum along with other aspects of the teaching-learning process. Informal feedback from parents and community is received.

Teachers prepare detailed yearly plan for completion of curriculum. Teachers have to write lesson notes for effective teaching. Feedback is taken by teachers in the interaction with the students in the class room and in the meeting of the teacher guardian scheme.

Mahavidyalaya encourages teachers to analyze the curriculum provided by university. Whenever a new curriculum is given by university it is discussed in the departmental meetings. It is discussed with academic experts. The Mahavidyalaya also encourages teachers to participate in seminars or workshops on university curriculum.

# 1.4.2 Is there a formal mechanism to obtain feedback from students and stakeholders on Curriculum? If 'yes', how is it communicated to the University and made use internally for curriculum enrichment and introducing changes/new programmes?

Mahavidyalaya has feedback mechanism in this regard. Feedback of teachers is obtained in departmental meetings and teachers meetings. As and when required the feedback is forwarded to university. Teachers participate in seminars and group discussion curriculum and interact with academic peers.

#### 2.1.1 How does college ensure publicity and transparency in the admission process?

#### **Publicity of admission process:**

#### a) Prospectus:

At the start of academic year, college prepares updated prospectus which provides detailed information about the college regarding the courses offered and infrastructural facilities. It also provides intake capacity, eligibility criteria for admission to each course, fee structure, documents necessary for admission, etc.

It also enlists the subject combinations for three years B.Sc. course. Prospectus also provides information about academic as well as support facilities. The academic calendar, rules and regulations, prizes for rank holders are also mentioned in the prospectus.

#### b) College website:

In addition to issuing of prospectus, college has developed its website <a href="https://www.siddheshwarcollege.com">www.siddheshwarcollege.com</a> for the convenience of students and parents. The website contains all the information mentioned in the prospectus as well as detailed information about the faculty.

#### c) Print media:

College publishes advertisements about admissions in leading local and district level newspapers. Whenever new courses or subjects are introduced, college publishes the advertisements in the newspapers.

#### d) Transparency in admission process:

College follows all the norms for admission laid down by Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad. It follows the guidelines regarding reservation to the backward classes. Admission committee is formed for admission process. Admission committee helps the students for their admission. Admissions are done on the first come first serve basis.

College follows all the norms for admissions laid down by Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad and Government of Maharashtra. It follows the guidelines regarding Reservation to backward classes.

#### Admission to U.G. and P.G. Courses:

For UG and PG courses admissions are given on the first come first serve basis. Separate admission Committee is formed by the college for UG and PG courses. The admission committee guides the Students for admission process.

The students who fulfill the minimum criteria for admission as per university norms are given admissions on the first come first serve basis. The other colleges in our area follow the same procedure for admissions.

# 2.1.4 Is there a mechanism in the institution to review the admission process and student profile annually? If 'yes' what is the outcome of such an effort and how has it contributed to the improvement of the process?

The college takes a review of the students admitted in each course. The maximum intake for the B.Sc.F.Y. 240, B.A.F.Y. 240, B.Com.120. For M.A. Part First (Marathi) intake capacity is 60. After completing the strength of admissions as per the intake capacity, if some students want admissions in our college then permission is taken from the University for Excess Admissions. College maintains the group wise balance of students. After the admission process is completed, principal takes a review of the admission procedure from teaching and non-teaching staff. If any difficulty in admission process is reported, it is resolved in the next year.

The individual department monitors the progress of the students by maintaining the student profile. Thus slow learners and advanced learners are identified.

#### **Outcomes:**

Guidance is given for slow learners. Carrier guidance is provided for outstanding students.

#### a) Students from disadvantaged community

There is reservation for students belonging to disadvantaged community as per Govt. of Maharashtra notifications. The college takes every care to ensure the reservations meant for disadvantaged community every year. As the students for category get their tuition fees from the government, at the time of admission, college takes minimum fees excluding tuition fees from these students, so that these students get attracted for admission and their strength gets increased. In critical cases, the college level fee is excused.

#### **Differently-abled:**

#### **Minority community:**

The students coming from minority community are also eligible for scholarship of government. Students from minority community are informed about the scholarship and guided to apply for scholarship.

#### 2.2 Catering to diverse needs of students.

#### 2.2.1 How does the institution cater to the needs of differently-abled students and

#### ensure adherence to government policies in this regard?

As per the government's norms, seats are reserved to differently abled students. The college implements schemes of government of Maharashtra and U.G.C. for their benefit. The differently abled students are advised to make use of free ship provided by government. As library and reading room both are located at ground level, such students do not feel any inconvenience.

### 2.2.2 Does the institution assess the students' needs in terms of knowledge and skills before the commencement of the programme? If 'yes', give details on the process.

Yes. The student is assessed at the time of admission on the basis of marks at entry level, his/her interest, computer literacy, communication skill, etc. by the teachers. The subject teachers also assess the knowledge and skills of the students through interaction and discussion with them. It is expected that this analysis and the performance of students at the qualifying examinations are likely to create a base for monitoring the future progress of students.

## 2.2.3 What are the strategies drawn and deployed by the institution to bridge the knowledge gap of the enrolled students to enable them to cope with the programme of their choice? (Bridge/Remedial/Add-on/Enrichment Courses, etc.)

Through class room interaction and discussion with students, the teacher identifies slow learners (students having knowledge gap) initially. Such students are also identified on the basis of marks obtained in the internal examination.

To bridge the knowledge gap, the teachers make the students to revise and recall their knowledge gained in previous classes. Teacher guides the slow learners in different ways in the vacant time.

### 2.2.4 How does the college sensitize its staff and students on issues such as gender inclusion, environment etc.?

In our college, equal importance is given to male and female students. Programmes are conducted by N.S.S. on same platform for male and female students. Practicals are also commonly conducted. There are common facilities such as library, canteen, conference hall and reading room etc. for male and female students. There is no differentiation in between

male & female students and equal treatment is given to them in each and every activity of college.

In case of awareness about the environment, lectures of eminent resource person, wallpaper activities etc. are done.

### 2.2.5 How does the institution identify and respond to special educational/learning needs of advanced learners?

The teachers identify the advanced learners through their performance in previous examinations and through interactions with them. The advanced learners are also identified on the basis of performance in internal and University examinations. Such active students are selected.

The institution adopts following strategies for facilitating advanced learners:

Felicitation of meritorious students in annual gathering and in special programmes.

By encouraging advanced learners to participate in various curricular and co-curricular activities; such as seminars, group discussion, quiz competitions, etc.

Steps to enhance their communication skills, art of reading-learning and inculcate reading habit.

By organizing interactions with alumni pursuing higher education as well as those holding higher positions.

Parent –Teacher scheme is implemented to provide more care for advanced learners.

2.2.6 How does the institution collect, analyze and use the data and information on the academic performance (through the programme duration) of the students at risk of drop out (students from the disadvantaged sections of society, physically challenged, slow learners, economically weaker section sections etc.)

After declaration of results by the University, results of every class and all subjects are analyzed. The student failed in examination is advised to apply for supplementary examination. Counseling is done by the senior teachers. The institution gives the facility to borrow the necessary books from the library. Every care is taken so that he or she should not be thrown out of the stream. To minimize the dropout rate, daily attendance is taken in every lecture.

#### 2.3 Teaching -Learning Process:

### 2.3.1 How does the college plan and organize the teaching, learning and evaluation schedules? (Academic calendar, teaching plan, evaluation blueprint, etc.)

Academic calendar of college is planned every year by the IQAC. While preparing the academic calendar, the committee takes into account, the academic calendar prepared by the university.

Academic calendar of college is mainly based on the two important provisions, which are as below.

The university specifies the framework for academic schedule-Teaching, Learning, and Evaluation. It includes number of semesters, working days, number of subjects-paper taught, teaching hour per theory paper or practical, semester end examination and method of assessment and declaration of result. Detailed syllabus for all subjects is prescribed by the university.

Internal examination committee prepares the schedule for internal examination. Based on these provisions, teaching, learning and evaluation schedule of college is planned, organized and informed to the HODs for implementation.

The departmental meeting is conducted in which teaching plan for each paper is prepared. Departmental meetings are conducted at regular intervals to discuss the completion of syllabus as per the plan. Extra periods are taken to complete the syllabus, whenever required. Students get information about the academic programme. Teachers get information about the schedule and ensure the total attention for the completion of syllabi and possible revision.

At the end of each semester, an examination is held by the university and is evaluated by the university except B.Sc. F.Y., B.A. F.Y. and B.Com. F.Y. Assessment of these exams is done by the college as per the evaluation rules of university and report is sent to university.

#### 2.3.2 How does IQAC contribute to improve the teaching-learning process?

IQAC conducts meeting at regular intervals. It circulates its plans and perspectives to all staff members. It collects record time to time and maintains documents. IQAC also collects

and analyses feedback from students, alumni and parents. Following are the measures taken by IQAC in quality enhancement and to improve the teaching-learning process.

- Preparation of academic calendar.
- Analysis of university results at the beginning of academic year and to decide the measures required for improvement of results.
- To encourage the staff to attend conferences, seminars, workshops, teachers training programme, so as to get their knowledge updated.
- To motivate the staff to undertake major and minor research projects.
- To encourage the students for their involvement in cultural, scientific, and social activities.
- To obtain feedback from students regarding teaching-learning process as well as infrastructural facilities.
- To consider the improvements suggested by the students regarding teachinglearning process, library facilities, sports, ICT, laboratory facilities, or any other facilities and to take measures for their implementation.

## 2.3.3 How learning is made more student-centric? Give details on the support structures and systems available for teachers to develop skills like interactive learning, collaborative learning and independent learning among the students?

College has provided the following support structures and systems to develop skills of the teachers like interactive learning, collaborative learning and independent learning among students:

Interactive learning:- Students seminars are arranged. For seminars all the audio visual aids like computer, LCD-projector and other teaching aids are made available to students. Collaborative learning:- The educational tours, excursions, visits to research centers, industrial units and university departments are arranged time to time. The students and the teachers are benefitted with this collaborative learning experience. The interaction between office bearers, employees of these centers and our students & teachers derive proper output. Independent learning: - There is project work for second year students in environment and third year students of computer science, Students are encouraged for participating in seminars, wall paper activity. The activities like seminars, college day, home assignment, independent practical's etc. are useful in the development of independent learning skill

among the student. College provides internet facility, reading room to students. The college has subscribed for INFLIB-NET N-list, through which more than 97000 e-books and 4000 e-journals are made available to students, which facilitates independent learning among students.

### 2.3.4 How does the institution nurture critical thinking, creativity and scientific temper among the students to transform them into life-long learners and innovators?

The college has provided a good infrastructure facility to the students. All the departments have well equipped laboratories. Books are provided to students during their practicals. Teachers encourage the students to prepare posters on the scientific aspects. In addition to this science quiz is also organized. The students are motivated by the teachers to participate in various competitions organized by the other colleges. In zoology department, quiz is organized each year. Study tours, industrial visits, are also organized for the students. The students are motivated to appear in the competition examination like IIT, GATE, MPSC, UPSC etc.

Students participate in the youth festival organized by the university. The students are encouraged to write the articles, poem. etc. in the college magazine 'VICHARVEDH'.

All these efforts transform the students into life-long learners and innovators.

2.3.5 What are the technologies and facilities available and used by the faculty for effective teaching? E.g.: virtual laboratories, e-learning-resources from National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning (NPTEL) and National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology (NME-ICT), open educational resources, mobile education, etc.

The college is quite aware about the use of modern teaching aids. Every science department in the college has been provided with computer and internet.

In AV room teachers take lectures on LCD projector using ICT. Our faculty is now more dependent on e-content freely available on internet. Faculty members use educational CDs, software like MATLAB, UGC programme, Discovery, National Geographic, Animal Planet, Documentaries, for effective teaching learning process.

The college has subscribed for INFLIB-NET N-list, through which more than 97000 e-books and 4000 e-journals are made available to the faculty members and students.

### 2.3.6 How are the students and faculty exposed to advanced level of knowledge and skills (blended learning, expert lectures, seminars, workshops etc.)

The internet is primarily used by the faculty as well as students for up gradation of knowledge. In addition to this, the recent trends in all subjects are available in journals, magazines, periodicals and newspapers, which are readily available in the library of college. As mentioned above, college has subscribed for INFLIB\_NET N-list. The students and faculty have access to this information constantly.

The guest lectures and seminars are organized on the current issues, so as to develop insights into the current issues. It helps the students and faculty to keep pace with the recent developments in various subjects. Besides this, the teachers are motivated to attend seminars, conferences, workshops and also deputed to attend orientation and refresher programmes. In this way, the students and faculty exposed to advanced level of knowledge and skills.

## 2.3.7 Details (process and the number of students benefitted) on the academic, personal and psycho-social support and guidance services (professional counseling/mentoring/academic advices) provided to students?

The college provides to students the following academic, personal, psycho-social support and guidance services:

In our college, there is a department for the guidance of various competitive examinations 'spardha pariksha mandal'. There is no post-graduation in science subject in our college and therefore campus interviews generally do not take place of reputed companies. But teachers always guide the scholar students about the future opportunities in job.

The teachers also play a role of guardians and mentors of students. They guide the students on personal level. It establishes rapport among the students and teachers. Lectures on important issues of health are organized by college.

Occasionally the students receive academic advice at the time of inaugural functions of the various committees. The dignitaries having academic aptitude, the authorities from the universities and educationalists from the region are invited to extend academic advice to our students. The students are informed about advanced courses, like PG courses in different subjects time to time. They are informed about the websites of reputed educational

institutes like ICAR, NCL, TIFR, BARC. Alumni of serving higher posts are invited to deliver a speech.

2.3.8 Provide details of innovative teaching approaches/methods adopted by the faculty during the last four years? What are the efforts made by the institution to encourage the faculty to adopt new and innovative approaches and the impact of such innovative practices on students learning?

Since technology has emerged in every field of life, it has a revolutionary impact on teaching methods. The college has been trying to make corresponding changes in the use of new technologies and methods for teaching, learning and governance. The faculties of the institution use computers, laptops, LCD projectors, internet, educational CDs. They are fledgedwith other supporting tools like printers, scanners.

The institution is very keen regarding use of these modern teaching aids. The Principal and Vice-Principal verify time to time, the use of ICT by the faculty and proper suggestions. Students are highly benefitted by these innovative teaching methods. Their interest is increasing day by day. Besides this, they are getting technical knowledge about handling these equipments.

#### 2.3.9 How are library resources used to augment the teaching learning process?

The college has well equipped library. It contains 2977 reference books on the syllabus for senior, 3276 for junior college, 1431 other references, 7010 text books, 29 journals and periodicals, 13 newspapers. UGC recommended IBMAN library automation software is installed in the library. The OPAC facility is available. The students can easily locate the books on the basis of author, subject and title. Every enrolled student is the member of library. The students are allowed to borrow the books from library.

The college has subscribed for INFLIB-NET N-list, through which more than 97000 e-books and 4000 e-journals are made available to the faculty and students.

2.3.10 Does the institution face any challenges in completing the curriculum within the planned time frame and calendar? If 'yes', elaborate on the challenges encountered and the institutional approaches to overcome these.

Yes, the college faces many challenges in completing the curriculum within the timeframe.

- Challenges
- Late declaration of results.
- Internal examination schedule.

- Unexpected loss of working days.
- Measures adopted to overcome these challenges.
- Commencement of courses irrespective of results.
- By arranging extra lectures.

#### 2.3.11 How does the institution monitor and evaluate the quality of teaching-learning?

The teaching-learning process is monitored and evaluated by the Principal & Vice-Principal of the college. The quality of teaching and learning is assessed on the basis of the results of the subjects. At the end of academic year, the results of each subject and every paper are scrutinized and if results are not satisfactory, it is communicated to respective teacher and asked to improve the results next time.

There is no formal system for the monitoring and evaluation of the quality of teaching-learning. Some class rooms are under the watch of CCTV cameras. The principal and vice-principal observe the footage of teaching-learning process in the class rooms. Sometimes the principal & vice-principal take rounds to the class rooms and laboratories to supervise the process.

Principal & vice-principal advise the teachers to make the necessary amendments in the teaching-learning process.

Student's feedback is taken and suggestions are invited from the students regarding their expectations from teachers.

2.4.1 Provide the following details and elaborate on the strategies adopted by the college in planning and management (recruitment and retention) of its human resources (qualified and competent teachers) to meet the changing requirements of the curriculum.

#### Recruitment

The college is an aided college. It follows the norms of recruitment of teachers given by the university grant commission and government of Maharashtra. The policy of recruitment is as follow:

- > The policy of recruitment is transparent and recruitment is done by the sanstha
- > During the recruitment of staff, the college advertises the vacancies of posts in some national and state level newspapers and also on the website of the college.
- After getting application from the candidates, these are scrutinized.
- Thereafter the college demands the selection committee from university.
- ➤ The selection committee comprises the management members, principal, government nominee, vice-chancellor's nominee, two subject experts and head of the concerned department.
- ➤ Eligible candidates are called for interview.
- ➤ Selection committee conducts the interview as per the guidelines of the university and selects the most eligible candidates.
- List of selected candidates is displayed on the website of the college.

- > The selected candidates are given their appointment letter and their approval is sought from the university.
- Norms regarding the eligibility and reservations are strictly followed.

#### Retention

- Management is also very keen about examination results. Results are discussed at the each academic year in the meeting of local management committee.

During practicals, there is face to face communication, during which performance, behavior and overall subject knowledge of the students are observed by the teachers. These characteristics are considered for evaluation during

practical examinations. Students' contribution in NSS, sports, cultural activities etc. is given due importance.

#### Redressal of grievance at college level:

In case of grievance with reference to evaluation at University level, the student has to submit an application to the University along with the prescribed fees within the duration announced by the university. After revaluation, University communicates the result to the student. A student can also get a photocopy of his answer sheet and can ask for the revaluation of the answer sheet.

Besides the regular studies, the college organizes various activities through NSS, Students welfare department, Vidyarthini mandal, etc. which help in overall development of the students. College conducts the wallpaper activity four times in year. Spoken English classes, entrepreneurship awareness programs, carrier guidance and counseling, annual gathering and sport activities which are given importance. Study tours, industrial visits are also arranged. The students are encouraged to participate in the Youth festival organized by the university. All this helps to attain the graduate attributes among the students.


- Yes. The college have stated quality policy. It is developed as per the guidelines of NAAC and IQAC.

- ➤ Books are purchased under the guidance of Library Committee.
- Building construction, repairs and maintenance is monitored by construction committee.
- ➤ All committees involved in financial matters work as per University, UGC and Govt. rules.
- Internal and External audit is conducted to ensure the proper utilization of resources.
- > Governing council of sanstha verifies the financial matters time to time.

#### **Brief Note on implementation of Peer Team Recommendations**

In first accreditation, our college was given C grade by NAAC. Peer team visited to our college on 5th and 6th Oct. 2009. They have interactive meetings separately with Governing Council office bearers, Principal, Teaching faculty, Non-Teaching Staff, students, Alumni and the parents. They went through documents submitted by the college in support of self-study report and otherwise. The honorable member of peer team appreciated our efforts towards the quality education provided by our college and gave recommendations to further strengthen the curricular, co-curricular, and extracurricular and extension activities of the college. Most of the peer team recommendations are duly implemented during post accreditations. The efforts made to enhance the quality during post accreditation period are as follows....

• The central library is enriched by books and journal. The details are as follows Sr. No. Particular

Books & Journals No. Cost.

- 1 At First Accreditation (2009) 9456 value = 91063/-
- 2 At Reaccreditation (2015) 15849 value = 915500/-

During the post accreditation period 6393 books of the value of Rs. 824437/- and 14Journals of Rs.60767/- are added.

- The computerization of library is in progress. It is completed up to 80%. Audio Visual CD's and internet facility are provided in Library.
- Computerizations in admissions, examination and office administration is almost completed.
- Separate computer lab consisting of 37 computers LCD projector and internet facility is provided to Commerce department.
- Computer training is made compulsory to all students by providing "Hundred hours computer course" to all students by University. Students are not allowed to appear for UG exam without completing this course.
- A multipurpose auditorium for cultural and other activities is constructed.
- All efforts are made for recruitment of regular faculty. Appointments depends on the Roster Sanctioned by the special cell of the University and Govt. authorities. This process is time consuming. However the care is taken that the teaching of the concern subjects is not suffered in any case.
- For the subjects of Music, Sanskrit, Computer Science, Drama and TMPA faculty teachers are appointed by Management. Respectable amount of salary and annual increments are paid to them.
- Introduction of the PG courses in non PG departments is a process governed by University itself. We have some departments which have qualified faculty to start PG courses. But it is hardly possible to fulfill the conditions laid down by the University. However we are planning to introduce PG course in Science and Commerce department in near future.
- Efforts are made to increase the participation of girls in sports and students union activities. Girls are encouraged to participate in intercollegiate sports tournaments. For Team games and Athletics girls participated and brought prizes.




